Building Aesthetics

- In relation to the aesthetics of the building, the project architect worked closely with Architecture & Design Scotland in an effort to ensure the development related well to the surrounding environment.
- As a result of smaller adjacent buildings, natural zinc roofs which continue down the external walls will help minimise the building's impact on the skyline, whilst blending with the slates and tiles of surrounding buildings.
- The design incorporates steps in the facade, steep roof pitches and a variety of materials which all take their design cues from those found in historic brewers, like that of Townhead Brewery.
- The building's private aspect presents a calming contrast with the street frontage. Here cloistered decks interact with landscaped courtvards suitable for socialising and private gatherings, linking inside and out.
- The new civil space and key corners will include artwork depicting the history of Alloa. An existing mural of clay tiles celebrating the town's rich industrial heritage has also been reclaimed and incorporated.

Dementia Design

- In contributing to Clackmannanshire Council's Sustainable Ageing Policy, the design team collaborated extensively with Stirling University Dementia Services Development Centre (DSDC).
- Dedicated to improving the lives of those living with dementia, constant dialogue, plus the use of the DSDC's comprehensive **audit tool**, facilitated the creation of a highly dementia friendly design, which sought to achieve the highest level of Dementia friendly accreditation on offer.
- Central to this compliance has been the use of open-plan layouts, views front and rear, full height glazing, plus appropriate use of colour, materials, signage and landscaping in order to provide an extremely pleasant living environment which is easily navigated.
- Incorporating these features ultimately improved service delivery by creating an environment which facilitates independent living for as long as possible, as circumstances change.
